FYI- Dinner will not be available this year. We would like everyone to spend more time in the classrooms looking at all the wonderful things our students have been working on.

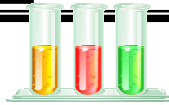

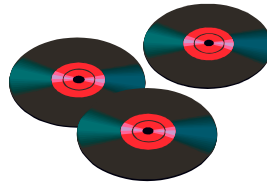

VACATION ABSENCE UPDATE

Several weeks ago, we ran a story about how vacation absences have cost us thousands of dollars in money from the state. We want to clarify, that we were only counting **VACATION** days. While illnesses also cost us money, we understand these are unavoidable and when your child is sick we prefer they stay home.

However, too many families continue to take additional time off. As of today, Northwood students have collected 310 absences due to families taking vacations during school days. This is equal to \$9,300. (\$30 per day).

Also, keep in mind, every day a child is absent, they miss 5.5 hours of instruction. If they are gone for a whole week,, they miss about 27 hours of learning.
